OVERVIEW

Boston Public Market (BPM) is a year-round indoor market designed to showcase the variety and quality of food grown, produced, or caught in Massachusetts and throughout New England. This opportunity offers prime retail space for local producers in the heart of Boston's Market District.

The BPM is managed by the Boston Public Market Association (BPMA) – a 501(c)3 organization whose mission is to operate a permanent year-round market that supports local food producers, provides fresh, healthy food to consumers of all income levels, and educates the public about food sources, nutrition, and preparation.

In 2012, BPMA was designated by the Commonwealth as the developer and operator of Boston's Public Market: a 28,000 square-foot indoor retail location on the ground floor of the Haymarket T-station building abutting both Boston's Greenway and Government Center. The Market is located at 100 Hanover Street.

The BPMA strives to bring in the highest quality products from the most local sources. We seek out businesses that educate customers about their products and production while representing the variety of interests and diversity of backgrounds within our community. The market is focused on local sourcing. Vendor offerings must be grown, raised, or produced in New England.

Pop-up vendors can apply to participate in the market for a limited time (a day, a weekend, or a week). As with the rest of the market, all products sold must be grown, raised, landed, or produced in Massachusetts or New England. In selecting short-term vendors, BPMA is searching for businesses that have products that do not overlap with existing Boston Public Market vendors' product lines. Please note that we do not bring in prepared food vendors for pop-ups.

APPLICATION PROCESS

REQUIREMENTS

After the intent to apply form has been approved, a BPMA team member will provide more information about the following items:

- A. A short vendor application
- B. Certificates of Insurance listing the BPMA and MassDOT as additionally insured
- C. If you sell a food product, you may need to apply for a temporary food vendor permit through the City of Boston health department
- D. Paying the invoice for the daily rate
